Exploring Ineffable

Earlier humans were in awe of the thunderstorm. They saw all of creation in the glistening surface of the seemingly endless sea that supplied them with food, tools and decor. They listened to the lapping, splashing rivers and the tingling whispers and caresses of the winds. They knew that there was something moving them that moved in everything else, something they could not see, but rarely, that they could yet feel and see the result of.

There was once a greater sense of the ineffable – of that which is unknowable and unspeakable. In the exploration of this word, ineffable, I found mysticism, many interesting papers, and of course, many sites offering the ineffable in relation to our search for God/dess.



We use metaphors to express the ineffable. Our words are like a cocoon, which encapsulates a reality that transcends any physical level of description.

William James America's great psychologist provided a description of the mystical experience in his famous collection of lectures published in 1902 as **The Varieties of Religious Experienc**e. In Lectures 16 and 17 he stated:

"...propose to you four marks which, when an experience has them, may justify us in calling it mystical...:

- 1. Ineffability
- 2. Noetic Quality
- 3. Transiency
- 4. Passivity

At Pathwork this past Sunday, we watched a video by Eckhart Tolle titled **The Deepest Truth of Human Existence**. We had a good conversation about his points and valued the experience. I was preparing to send out the link to a number of leaders and when I went to the site, the specific video was taken down! I will attempt to find it again but the learning is again the ineffable is hard to reproduce. It is usually a NOW experience.

However, at Sahale we live with a sense of "beyond words" in the air, land and people. Pedge Hopkins captures the essence of the word describing her experience. And you will find another description of the ineffable as mystery following Pedge's article. Mike also captures his sense of the ineffable at Sahale.

The Ineffable Quality of Sahale

Someone recently asked me what the word Ineffable means and I responded 'that which is



not articulable' (at least in English!). Pondering it some more I thought of the phrase, 'the whole is greater than the parts,' or the idea of two disparate things coming together and a new third thing emerges, wholly new, perhaps unintended or wonderfully surprising. Ineffability lives in between the lines of these notions for me. Certainly beyond reasoning. It lies in the land of Mystery.

Living in the Meadow Cabin, or 'the Shabin' (cross between shed and cabin) I have a catbird seat as witness and imbiber of what I've come to feel as the ineffable quality of this land called Sahale. On the surface two things came together; the land and its timeless history and aliveness and the most recent people to call her home....us folks. This joining of a group of people carrying wisdom, good intent and a desire to add to the health and wellbeing of the land, and all those whose path finds themselves here for however long is the alchemical, mysterious third thing. The ineffable quality shimmers through.... there's something more going on. I've gotten glimpses of it this year through the eyes, energy and beingness of our guests whether as AirBnB people or people attending weddings and other events. For me, the shift in them is dramatic when they are people who don't subscribe to ideas of Mystery or naturally embrace feelings that arise from places that the mind can't catalog or offer some reason for. It is very satisfying to witness! I know it by the quality of their smile that shows through their eyes. The words they try to find after they've been on a good walk around the land, enjoyed time with us in Potlatch and the opening of their hearts. I've felt it after a tour of the property for prospective event customers, even in the heart of a rainy winter's day. When groups arrive that know this ineffable quality when they feel or sense it, I hear phrases like, "I feel like I've come home."

And still it isn't articulable to me. These examples are felt clues of Mystery's presence. There is
