An important Goodenough Community Weekend: November 10-12, 2023, at Sahale Learning Center

From a weekend in March to its summer gathering in August, the Goodenough Community has been working on its collective future. The next opportunity to continue this important work will be November 10-12, 2023, here at Sahale and we would love to have you join us – whether or not you were at the community's annual August event.

A goal of the weekend is to continue reviewing community finances and where we are in work groups that were established at the August event, each with a different focus: Governance/ membership; vision and mission; fundraising and business development; and Sahale.

The General Circle, our community's governing body, has identified some outcomes for our weekend:

1. To continue the community's redevelopment started after the death of Colette. Processes to date: hired a consultant Sky Blue in January 2022, Alt-Lab 2022, feedback training and session Fall 2022, March Retreat 2023, Steering Committee Spring 2023, Summer Gathering August 2023.
2. To develop the Sociocratic circles further and garner interest in joining those circles
3. To develop shared understandings among us from which to make decisions
4. To build energy for governing the community
5. To maintain connections with members and friends
6. To maintain and increase our community's culture

In preparation for the weekend, we have a couple of articles for you to read, "A Humanist Manifesto," by David Brooks from the *Atlantic* website; and "Community Types and Definitions," comprised from items collected from the internet. Both selections are intended to stimulate our discussion of developing our vision and mission for our community. See attached links.

We welcome your ideas and energy and, most importantly, it will be an opportunity to connect and enjoy one another's company. We will also be celebrating Jim Tocher's 88th birthday!

But ... our communication styles were vastly different, our emotional hang-ups impossibly similar.

Tod and I came together more out of convenience, rather than in the excitement of a found romance. And in this arrangement, love grew. It snuck up on me.

Tod could also be bull-headed and super pissed-off at me. OK, dear, I hear you. And I love you. I love you.

Tod knew how to listen and reflect back, to give support to a troubling moment, my own and others'.

We were companions, entwined in the larger forces of shared community and family celebrations. Love snuck up on me. Love grew.
